As you navigate your way through the road construction on Pointer Trail, you might notice on our church lawn what looks like a Nativity Stable...well, in fact, it is! The stable was the place where King Jesus came to earth as Emmanuel-God with Us! But-why a stable in September?

This month, Jews around the world will be celebrating the High Holy days of Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur, and climaxing with *Sukkot*-or the Feast of Tabernacles. Sukkot is a joyous harvest festival lasting one week. Families will eat and sleep in temporary huts or shelters, in commemoration of God's presence with them in their 40-year sojourn through the desert. John 7 records that Yeshua (Jesus)

Himself went up to Jerusalem to celebrate this Feast!

Our "stable" is actually a sukkah-it's intended to be makeshift and shabby, made of sticks, boughs, palm branches, and the like. They are only occupied during the Feast and are temporary in every sense of the word. Jesus fulfills the symbolism of the sukkah by humbling Himself and coming to us in the frail, destructible body of a helpless baby. Like the Feast pilgrims, His sukkah was also temporary. Jesus was here for only a short time; However, He promises to return and harvest those who believe. What a glorious festival there will be when He finally returns!

That is the glorious promise of the Sukkah-the best is yet to come! As we are told in Revelation, 21:3, "Behold the Tabernacle of God is with men and He will dwell with them and they shall be His people and God Himself will be with them and be their God." Jesus Christ is the Tabernacle of God! When the glorious day comes and He returns, Christ will dwell among His people again. This is the ultimate fulfillment of the Feast of Tabernacles!

While waiting for His return, we invite you to join us at the Oaks Manor Retreat Center on Friday, September 13, for an outdoor celebration of the Feast of Tabernacles. The beautiful grounds there have been prepared for us to enjoy a one night camp out and worship under the stars, along with great Israeli food, dancing, crafts for the kids and more. (Bring your fishing gear!) Whether or not you choose to camp, this will still be a great opportunity to come and reconnect with the Jewish Roots of your faith, as Pastor Wes has been encouraging us to do.

The following week, on September 22nd, the Heritage family will combine for one glorious Feast of

Tabernacles service at 10:00 at the VHBS Fine Arts Center. Rick Endel has assembled a great orchestra and the Arrows International Dancers will be with us again. Come and celebrate the Feast!



PRAYER SHAWL MEETING


