From as early as I can remember I've loved the old hymn, Pentecostal Power. The words and music are by Charles Gabriel, though he attributed the words to Charlotte Homer, a pseudonym. It is found in many Methodist, Baptist, Revival, and Pentecostal hymnals. Gabriel was the music minister at Grace Methodist Church in San Francisco until Homer Rodeheaver convinced him to come write and publish songs full-time for his publishing company. This hymn, written in 1912, is a great heart-cry to the LORD. It asks Him to send a fresh wind and the fire of Pentecost on us today and to renew those same works today! I encourage you to meditate on these words and sing this song, asking God to do the same for us!

HALO REPORT THURSDAY 5/29/14

Well the halos had another successful evening of softball. The boys plowed out 54 runs and hit 11 homeruns in 2 games against our brothers from Cedarville Assembly of God (CFA) and First Baptist Alma. Although the Halos were victorious both opponents combined to hit a couple more home runs than the Halos. In fact, CFA played even with Heritage until our boys put up a total of 22 runs in back to back innings to run away with the game. Not so with Alma. Alma stayed within shootin' distance the whole game and fell short their last at bat, Halos win 24-20. So the difference was how well the Halo men focused their "Chi". Everybody was in sync and one with the muddy terrain and sloppy conditions. So in tune with the field of the sloppy moraines of mud were some of our players that on defense they chose wisely to "Ole" hard charging grounders like a bull fighter. Some even just dodged bad hops or dispensed with the use of the glove and fielded bare handed. Wes Hilliard brought a lot of focused energy, Chi, as he played like he was making up for lost time. Wes had a short season a handful of years ago that lasted all of 2.5 seconds as he pulled a hammy running to first. However, Thursday night he was a Bad Mad preacher. He went yard three times. The Wes 'ter' got more dirt on his jersey sliding around the bases than the whole team combined. Justin Goins' *feng shui Chi* was to be Charlie Hustle on defense. Justin hit his first home run of the season, scored 4 runs and he had a handful of RBI's until he separated his acromioclavicular (AC) joint hustling after a line shot. Tim Elkins continues to show the young ones how to play the game as he leads the team in RBI's and he has an on-base-percentage of 871. Travis Teague is hitting .875 with 17 runs and 10 RBI's; Dave Watkins .710, 19 runs and 15 RBI's and Jason Lolly .643, 8 runs and 4 RBI's, all focused their inner energy on whatever the situation called for....either setting the table or clearing the bases.
