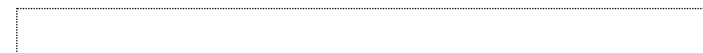

FROM YOUR PASTOR'S HEART ... THE POWER OF FULL ENGAGEMENT!

Allison and I had a wonderful time on our vacation! I think it may have been the only time in 23 years of full-time ministry that we took a full, two-week vacation apart from military leave or the sabbatical time the Heritage leaders granted me in 2011. I have to confess, "That is NOT good!" We should have always taken a full vacation – for YOUR sake! 😊 We normally didn't because I felt like I had been away too much during the summers for military duty. Honestly, I know it has taken a toll on us, and I am committed to living differently in the future for the sake of God's Kingdom. In order to fulfill our core values of LASTING and LEAVING A LEGACY, time away is essential.

I remembered while we were gone about the truth I have often taught on but rarely followed: ***In order to experience the power of full engagement, you must regularly fully disengage.*** You should treat life not like a marathon but like a series of sprints where you run hard for short distances, then rest and give yourself adequate time to recover.
