HALO REPORT

This is the time in the season to see if the league leading Halo's 13-1 record is "all fluff" or better said, "All hat and no cattle." The Halo men began the season ending tournament with two big wins verses Northpark in game one and Beyond Black in game 2. Northpark was not at full strength due to the fact that some of their players were serving as leaders in their summer church camp, but they were still competitive. In between the 6:30 game and the 8:30 game the Halos got to watch the next opponent for the evening between the winner of Beyond Black and First Baptist Van Buren. Both teams pounded out several homeruns between them. Beyond Black won the game in 5 innings impressing the Halos to opt to avoid going toe-to-toe with their power and rely on our defense to slow them down. So we chose to go with zero homeruns expecting them to choose 8. The average would then be $8 \div 8 = 1$.
