JERNIGAN

OKLAHOMA BAPTIST UNIVERSITY, Ford Music Hall, circa 1979...I find myself waiting once again in the narrow hallway lined on both sides by little rooms equipped only with upright pianos. This is the place where all good music students go to practice their scales, etudes, and recital pieces. The clash of multiple keys and vocalizing leaks through the doors as you wait your turn for a room to open up. I'm drawn to a sound quite distinct from the rest...instead of the usual classical renderings executed in various levels of skill, there's a different thing happening in that room just a few doors down. I take a peek in the little rectangular window...okay, I recognize this guy. Dennis. He's a freshman, I think, but, *what is that music he's playing??* I tap on the door, he looks up from his musical reverie, and signals that I'm welcome to come in.

"Hey, what is that you're playing?" I ask.

He shyly, awkwardly, responds. "Oh, just something I wrote."

"Start over. I want to hear it from the beginning."

Dennis's hands move fluidly across the keyboards, and in an effortless tenor, he weaves a song story he calls "Sheep Song". It's about the shepherd who leaves the flock to rescue the one lost lamb. I'm stunned.

I blurt out, "Man, your music is going to go around the world. One day, thousands will be singing your songs!" (The naivety of that statement can only be fully appreciated when you realize we were on a Baptist campus. They didn't teach us about "words of knowledge" there. But, I had one anyway!)

That brief encounter in Ford Music Hall led to a series of events that resulted not only in musical collaboration, but more importantly, in a lifetime of friendship and support through our parallel ministry journeys. My words indeed came true. Following graduation, Dennis Jernigan and I toured together for 3 years in a vocal band. In that period of time, Dennis experienced devastating brokenness followed by a powerful encounter with the unconditional love of God. From there, his gift of worship and song to broken people was defined, and his world-wide ministry was launched. In the formative years, he was mentored by such people as Anne Herring of the 2nd Chapter of Acts, and James Robison Ministries. He went on to write literally hundreds of songs and released dozens of original recordings. His songs of freedom have been recorded by some of the top Christian recording artists of our generation, and his classic *You are My All in All*, remains on the CCLI top 100 list. Through it all, his heart remains to help people find true freedom and their identity in Christ, as he has found it.

Over three decades later, Dennis Jernigan and I converge once again. For the next several days, I'll be in Colorado Springs, reprising my role as Simon Peter in *GOD WITH US*. To play Peter authentically, I draw from my own experience of failure and brokenness. In my absence, I'm honored to introduce the ministry of Dennis Jernigan to Heritage this coming Sunday; for like thousands of others,

Dennis has sung songs of deliverance over my life, and I was rescued in part because of his demonstration of God's tenacious love for me. Don't miss the opportunity this Sunday to hear the Lord rejoice over you. (Zephaniah 3:17)

WHITE AS SNOW



"Abominable" was so much more than a ski trip! "Abominable" was an opportunity to be reminded of the vastness of God's glory and how creation sings out His praises. Psalm 148:1-6 says, "Praise the LORD. Praise the LORD from the heavens; praise him in the heights above. ²Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his heavenly hosts. ³Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all you shining stars. ⁴Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies. ⁵Let them praise the name of the LORD, for at his command they were created, ⁶and he established them for ever and ever—He issued a decree that will never pass away." "Abominable" was an opportunity to come face to face with our sin. Isaiah 59:2 claims, "But your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear." "Abominable" was an opportunity to experience what God allowed His Son to endure for our sin! "He himself bore our sins" in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; 'by his wounds you have been healed.'" (1 Peter 2:24). "Abominable" was an opportunity to understand the

depths of God's love for us! Ephesians 3:17-19 says, "And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge--that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. And finally, "Abominable" presented us all with the choice to allow God to make a change in us forever; the old must go and the new must come. "You have had enough in the past of the evil things that godless people enjoy...That is why the Good News was preached to those who are now dead--so although they were destined to die like all people, they now live forever with God in the Spirit" (1 Peter 4:3a & 6). Abominable is defined as something detestable. Anything that is not of God is just that. We have this ability to lessen sin and its consequences. Let's not forget what sin's ultimate price is: death! Jesus paid that price! **He paid the price for you and me!** As we saw the beautiful snow fall on our final day of skiing, it was a reminder of what God wants to do in our lives: eradicate anything that is abominable/detestable and replace it with Him and His love. He wants to make us white as snow...this is only done by surrender and the power of God through the work He has done in the life, death and resurrection of His Son. As we enter into the season in which we celebrate this glorious moment in our life story, I hope that the one reading this now, would take the time to "see if there be any wicked way" in you and ask God to lead you in the "way of the everlasting" (Psalm 139:24). Thank you so much to all who supported this trip through your prayers and finances. It is always my joy to journey with our kids on special trips like this. I am grateful for the opportunities Heritage gives us to do such amazing things that will have an eternal impact on our youth!
