Matthew 7:24-25 ²⁴ "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock.

The most critical part of a home or building is its foundations. It must be very carefully and meticulously done. There must be no shortcuts. You want to make sure the people doing it are people of great integrity who will make sure they dig down to the bedrock to make sure your house or building is founded on the rock. Jesus is clear about that.

For the past several months, I have been serving on the Trinity Annual Conference Delegation to the Convening Conference of the Global Methodist Church. I am also serving on the Conference Superintendent and Staff Relations Committee (CSSRC). This is very tedious and detailed work. I am very grateful for the people far more gifted in administration and attention to detail than I am! I am glad they are digging down to the bedrock, "dotting the 'I's' and crossing the 'T's' in our founding documents to make sure we have a well-established foundation upon which the following generations can build a great house that will withstand the storms of life and the assaults of the enemy. Soon after the convening conference, the CSSRC will be interviewing and hiring our first Conference Superintendent for the Trinity Annual Conference. He/She will be like a cross between a bishop and a district superintendent for our region.

Our Convening General Conference of the Global Methodist Church will be September 19-26 in San Jose, Costa Rica. Pray that all eyes are on Jesus and that He gets all the glory. May every decision reflect His will.

Jesus, Healer Then and Healer Now

This Sunday we are continuing our series on the Book of Mark, The Best News Ever. In Mark 2:1-12, Jesus heals a paralytic man. The paralyzed man's friends show



immense faith and creativity by finding a way to bring him to Jesus. This teaches us the value of persistence in overcoming obstacles and supporting our friends in times of need. We should all strive to be great friends, and find friends who will take us to Jesus in our darkest and hardest times. But Jesus did something before he healed the man physically, He forgave the man of his sins and healed him spiritually. On the

surface, it looked easier for Jesus to forgive the man of his sins, but if we look below the surface it cost Jesus everything. We all have some type of healing need whether it is physical, mental, marital, financial, or spiritual. This passage is encouraging and a great reminder that Jesus is still a healer like He was many years ago when He walked the earth. In verses 13-17, Jesus also gives us clues on how we should treat people no matter who they are. Jesus' choice to associate with tax collectors and sinners challenges societal norms and demonstrates a commitment to love. It encourages us to look beyond social labels and biases, extending compassion to everyone, especially those who are often overlooked.
