FROM YOUR PASTOR'S HEART . . . Family Reunion in Costa Rica!

Let me introduce you to some of your brothers and sisters. This past week I had the privilege of meeting many of our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Global Methodist Church from around the world. I met

people from every state in the union and from Costa Rica, Mexico, Peru, Brazil, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Kenya, South Africa, Romania, Bulgaria, Russia, Kyrgyzstan, Tanzania, Nigeria, Korea and many other countries. It is hard to describe the feeling of kinship and family that we felt ... These are "my people, my tribe."

Anbessu (Lion) Tolla planted 173 churches in Ethiopia, and he oversees 269 congregations. I'll tell you more of his story on Sunday. We are making plans for him to come preach at Heritage (He has family in Olathe, KS), and for us to take the College of Prayer to his church leaders. Dinu was a Romanian rock star touring the world who got arrested in Costa Rica. He read a Gideon Bible in prison and gave his life to Jesus. He made his way to the Methodist school and seminary in San Jose, became a pastor and was sent by the Costa Rican Methodist Church back to Romania to plant Methodist churches there. It was so moving to see his reunion with his Costa Rican brothers and sisters. Sergei is a

Korean-Russian who was led to the LORD while he was a university student in Moscow in 1992. Dmitri looks like a big, bearded lumberjack from the American Northwest, but he's a young pastor and district superintendent in Kyrgyzstan.

We came together to worship, to praise the LORD, to pray, and to organize for our future life together. It was an inspiring week. We want to get it right from the ground up.

Wednesday night, the conference elected six bishops (see picture) one from Nigeria, one from the Democratic Republic of Congo, a woman from Texas with ties to Arkansas, a woman from Georgia, Kenneth Levingston from Houston (who has preached at Heritage), and a man from Ohio. It is a very diverse group who will lead us. They will serve as the guardians of our doctrine and keep us on mission. They will also serve as evangelists and revivalists. One will be at our church on Sunday, March 2nd. They will not be the heavy-handed authoritarian

rulers of our past. They will be bi-vocational — serving a local church and serving the Global

Church.

In addition to our worship and planning meetings, we got to spend time doing missions and evangelism with the Costa Ricans. It was a joy. I got to be a part of a team serving a congregation in a low-income neighborhood with a young pastor couple. Their congregation has doubled in size since they came six months ago. We put a new roof and ceiling on their children's building. A young rancher named Will from San Angelo, Texas led our project. You would be so inspired by the enthusiasm of the young adult leaders of the church in Costa Rica.

Tuesday evening we had a joint worship service with over 1,000 Costa Rican leaders who came from all over the country for the event. Some travelled over six hours to be there. We were addressed by the president of the Costa Rican congress. It was amazing to see what God had done in that country through the service of faithful Christian leaders. God moved powerfully that night.

Thank you for sending me. I wish you could have all been there with me. It was my honor to get to represent you and the people of our Trinity Conference from Arkansas, Louisiana, and East Texas. Our next General Conference will be in two years in West Africa. After that, the General Conference will meet every six years.

P.S. I also got to reconnect in Costa Rica with old friends, Drs. Sky and Louise Forrester from Llano, TX. Allison and I started a Sunday School class with them in Tulsa back in 1987, and they helped cover the hospital and emergency room for Allison's dad in Siloam Springs in the late 1980's. They take mission teams to Costa Rica twice a year. They invited Heritage to join them for their trip in June. They'll be doing two projects: 1) repair work at a children's home and 2) manning a medical clinic serving Nicaraguan immigrants in northern Costa Rica.
