FROM YOUR PASTOR'S HEART . . . TIMOTHY TEAM -- Raising Spiritual Champions, Pt. 2\*

Two weeks ago I wrote about Timothy Team and our purpose to **transform children into spiritual champions.** We do this by systematically teaching them the Word of God, by showing them how to worship God passionately,

and by leading them to receive Jesus as their LORD and Savior. This was inspired and guided by George Barna's breakthrough research and book, **Transforming Children into Spiritual Champions: Why Children's Ministry Should be Your Church's Number One Priority.** 

I shared that Barna's research showed this transformation happens best **INTERGENERATIONALLY.** It happens when parents and grandparents study and memorize the same scriptures together with their children and grandchildren, and when children see these values lived out in their home.

Recently, Dr. Barna released what he says may be his last and most important book, **Raising Spiritual Champions: Nurturing Your Child's Heart, Mind and Soul.** He has examined over 200 of his organization's latest research polls among people in the United States. The data suggests that only 3% are living as true disciples of Jesus Christ. This should **ALARM** us!

Barna identifies, seven basic beliefs of a Biblical worldview. A worldview is "The overall perspective from which one sees and interprets the world (American Heritage Dictionary). A person's worldview is typically formed **before they reach the age of 13**! Barna's most recent survey shows that a majority of adolescents believes only one of the points of a Biblical worldview.

If a person believes all seven of these worldview pillars, they have an 83% chance of developing a complete biblical worldview and living as a disciple of Jesus. If a person rejects one or more of those seven cornerstones, they have just a 2% probability of developing a full biblical worldview.

At Heritage, we want to foster the pathway to intentional biblical formation and teach these cornerstones to our children, youth and adults to equip them to stand against the rising tide of secular humanism and radical Islam.

### "Seven Cornerstones of a Biblical Worldview,"

- 1. An orthodox, biblical understanding of God.
- 2. All human beings are sinful by nature; every choice we make has moral considerations and consequences.
- 3. Knowing Jesus Christ is the only means to salvation, through our confession of sin and reliance on His forgiveness.
- 4. The entire Bible is true, reliable, and relevant, making it the best moral guide for every person, in all situations.
- 5. Absolute moral truth exists—and those truths are defined by God, described in the Bible, and are unchanging across time and cultures.
- 6. The ultimate purpose of human life is to know, love, and serve God with all your heart, mind, strength, and soul.
- 7. Success on earth is best understood as consistent obedience to God—in thoughts, words, and actions.

Barna is quick to point out that these seven cornerstones are basic Christian tenets, not advanced or sophisticated theological constructs. "What's so shocking about these beliefs is how basic and simple they are— almost like an outline of what used to be the Sunday school lessons shared with elementary school children," Barna explained. "These are not advanced theological principles; they're straightforward principles for how to make the most of the gift of life."

Barna continued, "Reviewing the data made it clear that these principles, although simple, serve as a foundation on which you can build a more satisfying and influential life, and one that brings glory to God." till, these deceptively simple biblical principles require more than casual assent. The worldview research indicates that an individual must have both an understanding of the principles and a passionate, thoughtful **ownership** of them in order to build a biblical worldview.

Where do you stand in relation to these cornerstones? Do you have a biblical worldview? If you are uncertain yourself, then your children and grandchildren are in trouble. Please know that in Timothy Team and in all our ministries at Heritage, we are making a concerted effort to impart and solidify a Biblical worldview in all our children, adolescents and adults.

1 Corinthians 15:1-2 says, "Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken **your stand**. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain."

Let's take our **stand** and equip our children to do the same! Sign them up for Timothy Team and join them in the journey (Deadline for children's registration is July 28<sup>th</sup>). Children's ministry is the priority, but **THE KEY** is spiritually mature adults who love Jesus, know the Word, and live out and **impart** this Biblical Worldview to the upcoming generations.

Let's do our part!
